Random Event	There has been a burglary (or attempted burglary) of the Vaults beneath the Mint.		
Background	The Treasury is the financial arm of the City Government of Tehmor. It is responsible for minting coins, collecting taxes and duties and managing the City budget and expenditure, reporting to the Council. It also finances and runs the Bank of Tehmor and regulates other Banks (but does not guarantee their creditworthiness). It jealously guards its independence from the Overlord. Its main source of revenue is the customary duties on caravans and ships, which are set by the Council at levels no higher than competitor cities. There are no income or wealth taxes in Tehmor and most services in the City are provided by private enterprise rather than the Government. The Treasury itself is largely financed by its private		

	<p>banking operations and investments. At times of War special levies may be raised to finance the expansion of the Army and Navy and hire of mercenaries. Treasury agents in the City comprise Tax Collectors and Enforcers, the latter being concerned with collecting unpaid duties, removing counterfeit Tehmorian currency (and other counterfeit coins) from circulation, uncovering corruption in the Treasury itself and countering the efforts of the Thieves' Guilds and other Factions to infiltrate the Treasury. The Vaults beneath the Mint are rumoured to hold the largest concentration of Gold, Platinum and Mithril in the City, with the Treasury being particularly concerned to buy up or otherwise acquire Mithril. The official line from the Treasury is that most of its business is paper-based and it only holds enough stocks of precious metals to ensure liquidity.</p>
